April 10 **Michael Bumsted** - It's a Mystery!

April 17 **Charlene Diehl** will present *The Moon of Letting Go* by Richard Van Camp. Charlene is a Manitoba author, poet and Director of the Winnipeg International Writers Festival.

April 24 **Brandon Christopher** will present *Hag-Seed* by Margaret Atwood. Brandon is an Associate Professor in and Chair of the Department of English, University of Winnipeg. His research and teaching focus on early modern drama (especially Shakespeare).

May 01 **Michelle Faubert** will present *The Life of Pi* by Yann Martel. Michelle is an Associate Professor at the University of Manitoba. Her areas of specialization include Romanticism, representations of suicide, the history of psychiatry and historical feminism.

May 08 **Vanessa Warne** will present *To the Lighthouse* by Virginia Woolf. Vanessa is an Associate Professor at the University of Manitoba. Her areas of research interest include Victorian literature and culture, disability studies and history of the book.
