

Dr. Tara Horrill was the 2018 recipient of the Joanne Greene Memorial Scholarship (Graduate Studies) from the College of Nursing at the University of Manitoba. In March this year she obtained her PhD in Nursing from the University of Manitoba. Dr. Tara Horrill is a postdoctoral researcher at the University of British Columbia and the BC Cancer Agency. She is based in Winnipeg.

Dr Horrill is a registered nurse and in her current role is engaged in collaborative initiatives in partnership with health care providers, health system leaders, policymakers, and patients to address health inequities within the cancer care sector.
