- We have begun to change some of our behaviours and intend to continue with this initiative.

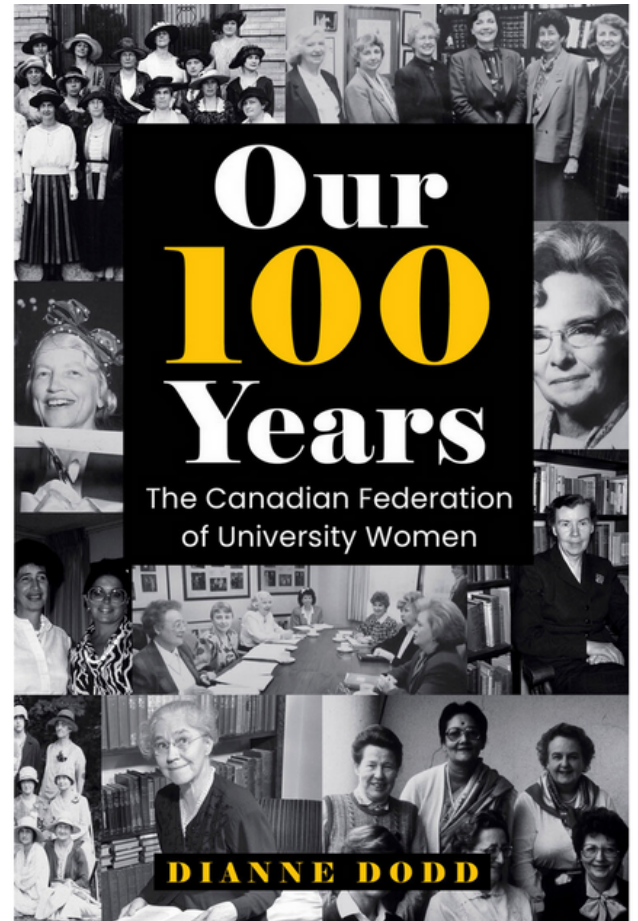

*To all the Jam, Jelly, Relish, and Pickle makers among you, the Bake Shoppe would be only too happy to showcase your delicious products at the Market this year.

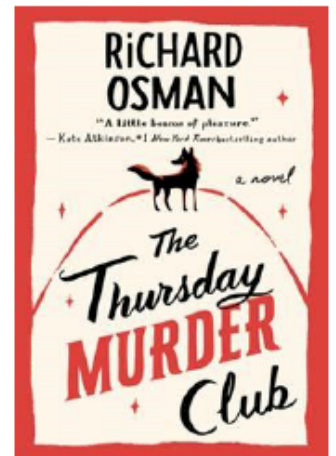
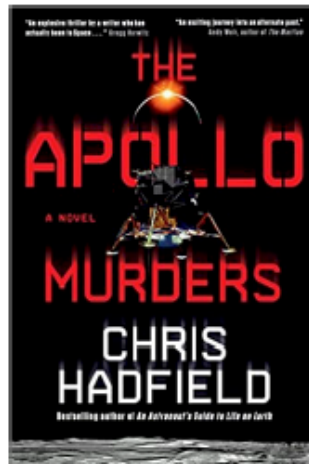
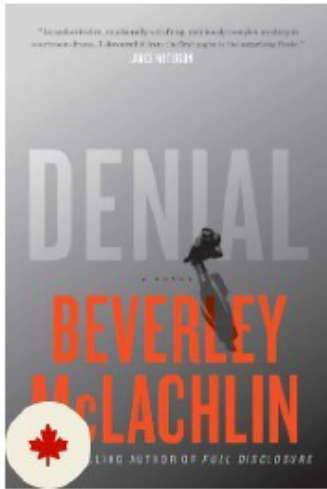

Information on joining the market as an external vendor will come out closer to November. Be sure to follow us on Facebook to stay up to date!

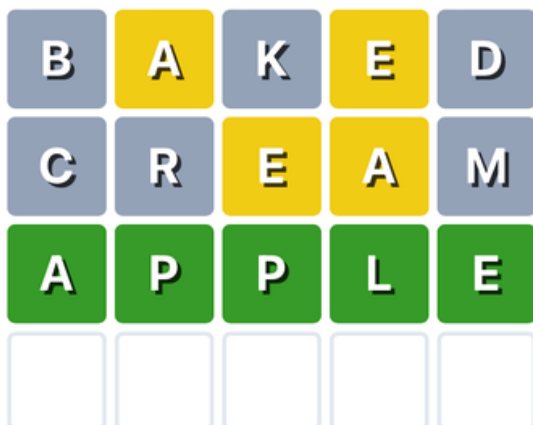
Thank you all so much for your support, we are looking forward to having an in-house Christmas Market again !
