
Bringing Women to the Front Lines of Sports Coverage

# **Current Issues & Actions**



As fall approaches, we look forward to full Club activities again.

We at CIA ended our June activities with a bang when members of our committee met with Minister Rochelle Squires. Jane Ursel spoke to the data she has amassed over the past few years related to the incidence of intimate partner violence in our city and the resulting response of our legal system. Recognizing that federal bail laws are beyond provincial jurisdiction, we advocated for increased intervention with offenders, programming at no cost, earlier intervention, and gathering data to demonstrate the degree of effectiveness of programs. The Minister and her staff were fully engaged in the discussion.

We were pleased to hear that in the recent budget, the Minister was able to obtain approval for a new funding model for shelters funded by the Family Violence Prevention Program. The new model will help align funding inequity. In addition, with a 3.2 million investment in the first year, it will support additional staff and salary increases.

Now we look forward to considering new opportunities for advocacy. Take the time to look at CFUW's newly passed resolutions. 
