


Bar 54 - Halloween Style


DINNER AND SPEAKER

The Hamilton Collection: Winnipeg's Paranormal History



How do we explain what is seen in the Hamilton Collection? Over 700 photographs and more than 1300 notes and accompanying documentation pertain to the seances held in the Hamilton's home between 1918 and 1945. The images detail numerous aspects of spiritualism including telekinesis, teleplasm, trance states, and various other paranormal psychic phenomena.

Join us on **Wednesday, October 25th** as **Dr. Shelley Sweeney** presents on the origins of these intriguing papers held by the University of Manitoba Archives. She will provide insight into Dr. T.G. (Thomas Glendenning) and Lillian Hamilton, the couple behind the séances that drew the interest of such distinguished persons as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and Prime Minister Mackenzie King. She will also explore what it is about the collection that continues to captivate local, national, and international interest.



Ashley Schers is the recipient of the 2019-2020 UWC Scholarship Trust Fund Graduate Scholarship, Faculty of Arts, University of Manitoba, and has attained her Master of Arts in Archival Studies, Dept. of History, University of Manitoba. She is currently Archivist, Hudson's Bay Co. Archives, Archives of Manitoba.

The Hudson's Bay Co. holds some of the oldest records of early Canadian history starting long before Confederation, and documenting interactions with Indigenous peoples before the formation of a federal government. As an archivist for the HBCA, the primary objectives and activities of our speaker focus on these records and how to present them to the public.



A lot of her work has concentrated on the families and personal stories relating to Indigenous peoples found in the financial accounts of the HBC fur trading posts. A very important aspect of her work is how the information can be provided to Indigenous communities doing research on their own ancestors and histories.

The program will be presented on the Main Floor of Ralph Connor House. Refreshments will be served in the Dining Room. There will be a \$10 charge for the refreshments.


