IN MEMORY

1947 - 2023

Sheila Andrich joined the University Women's Club of Winnipeg in 1970; a member for 53 years. She will be remembered as kind, witty, generous, and intelligent. Sheila was always ready to be a friend to anyone she encountered; even after her health failed her.

Born in Winnipeg August 18, 1947, to parents Betty (Alice Elizabeth) Kime and Jack (John Joseph) Andrich, Sheila grew up with an older brother Bill who died when she was seventeen years old. She attended Vincent Massey Collegiate, the University of Winnipeg, the University of Manitoba BA, BA(Hons) and the University of Western Ontario MLS. Sheila worked for the Winnipeg Core Area Initiative for several years before starting her work at the University of Manitoba Education Library in 1988. She transferred to The Elizabeth Dafoe Reference Department in 1997, where subjects Psychology and Women's Studies became her responsibility. As well, she was active in the Status of Women Committee with Dr. Rosa Bruno-Jofre.

In honour of her father, a veterinarian by profession, Sheila and her mother established a scholarship at the Veterinary College at the University of Guelph. In 2001, Sheila and her father created the Betty Andrich Award at Red River College, formerly MIT-Manitoba Institute of Technology), in memory of her mother who was a graduate of the College's inaugural Library Technician program.

Sheila retired in 2008 and travelled with her friend Stella to many fascinating places: Prince Edward Island, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, Czech Republic, Cuba, and nearby American states. Sheila enjoyed gardening, baking, movies, theatre, music, books, and eating out at restaurants.

Sheila died September 5, 2023, after four years of battling numerous health issues. She will be missed by Stella and her many friends and colleagues.

Ukrainian Newcomers in Manitoba

Since the onset of the war in February 2022, more than 25,000 people from Ukraine have become newcomers in Manitoba. According to the Province, on a per capita basis, more Ukrainians have sought refuge in Manitoba than in any other Canadian province. **Joanne Lewandowski**, President of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress (UCC) Manitoba Council, will talk with us about these newcomers' experiences, and the ways UCC and its partners have been supporting them through this transition.

According to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, there have been 28.8 million border crossings out of Ukraine since the Russian invasion began in February 2022. Many people have sought refuge in neighbouring countries.

Current Issues & Actions



October brought us a new government with many new MLAs on each side of the aisle. What a wonderful opportunity to enhance the level of decorum in our legislature. We will be contacting the governing party and the opposition to support their efforts towards an increased level of respect in our legislature.

Of the CFUW resolutions for 2023, we will be following up on the resolution supporting maternal health. Stay tuned for our progress in addressing this issue.

Thinking of our environment, we had a discussion noting how much less fuel is used when motorists slow down. On the highway driving a speed of 120 km/hr uses 20% more gas than travelling at 100 km/hr. Slowing down saves gas and the environment. This issue has many facets and opinions. Our city is currently exploring residential speed limits and is piloting lower limits in four residential areas. You can learn more at winnipeg.ca/reducedspeedneighbourhoods. The website includes a travel time estimator. I tried the difference from my home in Charleswood to the Club. According to their estimator, it would take me an additional 38 seconds if I was driving at 30 km/hr on the collector and local roads or 8 seconds at 40 km/hr. That certainly gave me a new perspective! The site offers a survey as well. **Let your opinion be known.**

Our next meeting is set back a week due to Christmas Market. We will meet on **Thursday November 9 at 1:30.** At our next meeting we will view the CFUW video on Advocacy. Anyone interested in learning more about advocacy, please join us.
