

The film features footage recorded as members of the Afghanistan Human Rights and Democracy Organization (AHRDO) took unpredictable – and dangerous – steps across borders to escape war conditions and oppression in Afghanistan in search of peace and refuge in Canada.

Current Issues & Actions



Looking forward to Spring? Get ready for a new batch of proposed resolutions from CFUW. In March we will receive the work of clubs around the country and have the opportunity to review, comment, and suggest amendments to their proposed resolutions. In this, we are part of the national advocacy of CFUW.

Raising Awareness is a pivotal step in the CFUW Advocacy Framework. Lately the Current Issues and Actions committee has been raising your awareness to maternal mortality in Canada.

Here is another shocker of a statistic:

Since the 1990s the Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) in Canada has increased from 5.1 to 11.9 per 100,00 live births! (This statistic is quoted by the the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Canada.)

In following up on the CFUW resolution re maternal mortality, we sent letters of advocacy to each Member of Parliament from Manitoba. In March we look forward to meeting with Raquel Dancho, MP for Kildonan - St. Paul, who responded to our letter.

The recent tragedy in Carman weighs heavily on our minds. We have many questions for the justice system, the child protection system and the mental health system. The issue of gun violence and especially of gender-based violence is once again in the front of mind.

How might we raise our voice of ongoing concern? Each year we can participate in the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence which runs from November 25 the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women until the Human Rights Day December 10.

Are you remembering to do your part in reducing the use of plastic bags, plastic cutlery, plastic and styrofoam plates? I notice that Boston Pizza now sends home leftovers in a reusable and microwaveable container. It's hard to change our habits.
