From the article - *The moment she first* stepped inside Ralph Connor House, Penni Churko fell in love. "You walk through the doors and the house wraps you in a hug," Churko says. "It's a very friendly atmosphere and it is a gorgeous building. It's just beautiful." Located at 54 West Gate in Armstrong's Point, the 1914 mansion belonged to influential minister and novelist Charles Gordon. The 23-room riverside house has been home to the University Women's Club of Winnipeg since shortly after Gordon's death in 1937.
