CURRENT ISSUES & ACTIONS

Good bye summer and hello to the UWCW in high gear!

Current Issues and Actions' plans, that have been percolating over the summer, are now in full swing. This fall we are concentrating on the **16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence**. Gender-based violence is one of the most pervasive human rights violations in the world. Each year from November 25 to December 10, individuals and organizations participate in the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign and call for the elimination of violence against women, girls, and gender diverse people.

This year, December 6 marks the 35 anniversary of the École Polytechnique massacre where 14 women were murdered simply because they were women. On this day, we remember them.

The Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women (CEDAW)) describes gender-based violence as:

"Any act of gender-based violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, when occurring in public or in private life."

Statistics Canadian reports that 1 in 2 women in Canada have experienced gender-based violence since age 16.

We are asking the question, how have we progressed in protecting women?

16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM

Our committee is assisting the Lieutenant-Governor who will be hosting an event during the 16 Days. We are making progress on 16 Days calendar of local events focused on genderbased violence. We are also collaborating with the Program Committee on plans for an event at the Club. Once the details have been solidified, you will be invited to get involved in this issue that affects so many women.

The next meeting of the Current Issues and Actions committee is **Wednesday, October 16th.** If you have an interest in activism or are just curious, please join us.
