Applications are now open for the CFUW Charitable Trust (CT) until January 10, 2025.

This Trust's awards are for women pursuing graduate studies. The applications are managed by Universities Canada but the selection of award winners is made by the CFUW Fellowships Committee.

There are fourteen awards this year and more information can be found on the CT website at www.cfuwcharitabletrust.ca. If you know someone who may be interested, please pass this information along.

An advocacy update involves CFUW recently submitting a brief to the House of Commons Standing Committee on the Status of Women for its study on Gender-based Violence and Femicide. The brief focused on the importance of gun control measures as a critical way to prevent femicide. CFUW has a history of advocating for stricter gun control following the 1989 shooting at Ecole Polytechnique in Montreal. CFUW's brief can be read <u>here</u>.



#### From CFUW Georgetown: Petition for Drinking Water Regulations

For several months, CFUW Georgetown members have been working with **Susan Blacklin**, activist and author of Water Confidential, Witnessing Justice Denied on a petition to the House of Commons. Our members might recognize Susan's name from her visit to Ralph Connor House in May of this year.

The petition requests that the federal government - working in partnership with Indigenous people and with federal, provincial, municipal and territorial governments establish drinking water regulations for Canada that meet the standards established by the World Health Organization (Canada is one of two countries in the developed world that only has standards and guidelines for its drinking water.)

Blacklin has received the support of numerous organizations and environmentalists, e.g., Concerned Citizens of Walkerton, Water Watchers, Water Keepers, Yellow Quill Nation, Safe Drinking Water Foundation, and Soroptomists International. CFUW Georgetown is proud to add its name to the list.

The petition has been accepted and is now on the Government website in English and French. We have until **December 7** to have the petition electronically signed by 500 residents of Canada. When this happens, the petition will be presented in the House and the government must respond.

Hello Everyone,

The FRCH Board has been busy this Fall. In mid-October a meeting was set up with all three levels of our Historic, Heritage Designation representatives, as we are having to replace most of the windows and eavestroughs on Ralph Connor House. As an Historic site all levels of government will be involved in this process.

The meeting with these officials - Rina Ricci - Heritage Planner, City of Winnipeg -Planning, Property & Development. Jeff Gauley - Senior Heritage Conservation Officer - Manitoba Sports, Culture, Heritage & Tourism, and Jeffrey Thorsteinson -Historian, History and Commemoration Indigenous Affairs and Cultural Heritage Directorate - Parks Canada/Government of Canada, was held to gain information as to what will be required moving forward with this endeavour. This will be a very long process that will take years to complete, but the ball is now rolling!

An application for a grant was sent to the National Cost-Sharing Program for Heritage Places to help with the cost of the required assessment of the windows and eaves by all levels of government. We should hear if our application has been approved by April of 2025.

Living History Program: School Tours. The Program is still in need of a performer for the school tours - Charles Gordon's Secretary. It is an easy position to play and we have the script all ready to go! **If you want to see what the school tours are all about, please join us on December 11** when we will be hosting the Marion School grade 6 class for a tour.
