Co-Presidents' Message

Relationships matter. This year, CFUW is offering an opportunity to build or expand relationships with other members in the Prairie region through a regional conference to be held in Saskatoon, June 13th to 15th. Our Land Acknowledgement Statement is a statement about relationships. When we were advised that some of the terms we had been using to refer to different indigenous groups were not the names those groups used to identify themselves, we felt we should update our wording. In April, the Board approved the following statement, which had been developed through research by Pat Bozyk and discussion at the Communications/ Membership table. Some of the names are new to some of us; Debby Brown found a pronunciation guide, which will be available to assist those of us who read it at our events:

We acknowledge that we are on Treaty 1 territory, the ancestral lands of the Anishinaabeg, Ininewak, Anishininewuk, Dakota Oyate, and Dene, and the National Homeland of the Red River Métis. We also acknowledge that we receive our water from Shoal Lake 40 First Nation, in Treaty 3 Territory.

We are thankful for the benefits sharing this land has afforded us, acknowledge the responsibilities of the Treaties and welcome the opportunities to partner with Indigenous communities in the spirit of reconciliation.

As UWC begins our new 2025/26 year in May, we are grateful for all the relationships that flourish within the club and look forward to further opportunities for good conversations, learning and fun together.

The next step is to have the back parking area re-gravelled as the heavy equipment has made it a bit muddy; this should be completed within two weeks or so. Once the gravel is in place, we will be installing a permanent barrier of some sort along the bank. There will also likely be some repairs required to the grounds from the heavy trucks that removed all the debris from the Carriage House.
